INTRODUCTION

Once again, the Wildcat Foundation is poised to play a pivotal role in the future of the Mechanicsburg Area School District. True to our mission, "to strengthen the educational, cultural, wellness and athletic programs of the Mechanicsburg Area School District," we have identified significant needs at John H. Frederick Field. The foundation last enhanced the District's "front porch" with a new turf field in 2010; today, the Field's entrance and ancillary buildings need significant improvements. Additional construction of a new field house will provide valuable space and purpose.

A revitalized Frederick Field is essential to our rapidly expanding District and the Wildcat Foundation will set a new standard of excellence just as our previous campaigns did for the Trails & Trees Environmental Center and the turf field.

Our community responded generously in the past and we again call upon a wide base of constituents to support this effort to assure project completion in a timely and efficient manner. Our plan is to break ground no later than spring of 2020. We have established an ambitious goal of \$2.5 million, with solicitation occurring within the 2018 calendar year to accommodate a three-year pledge period.



HISTORICAL CONTEXT

The Mechanicsburg Area School District (MASD) may claim Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Park as its own, though in reality, in 1919, it was the initiative of a group of local merchants and businessmen who took it upon themselves to raise funds to purchase land connected to the existing field, which was owned by Mechanicsburg Borough and leased to the Mechanicsburg High School Athletic Association. When the purchase was complete, the land was "given to the people of Mechanicsburg as a memorial to those who lost their lives in World War I."

At that time, football was in its infancy and what was to become a multi-use field and stadium was not yet envisioned. Still the Mechanicsburg Club, a local service organization, agreed to fund the construction of the field house³, which exists to this day.

Years later, upon the death of John H. Frederick in 1994, the Mechanicsburg School Board of Directors recommended that the field at the west end of the Park bear the name of John H. Frederick Field as a lasting memorial to the beloved teacher, mentor, and winning football coach from 1937-1957, excepting two years of armed service duty during World War II.⁴

It wasn't until September 4, 1998 that the field was officially dedicated: John H. Frederick Field at Memorial Stadium.

Meanwhile, earlier in 1998, the MASD Board of Directors established the Wildcat Foundation, the educational foundation for MASD, whose mission is to strengthen the educational, cultural, wellness and athletic programs of the Mechanicsburg Area School District.

PROGRAMS & PROJECTS BROUGHT TO YOU BY THE WILDCAT FOUNDATION

While the Wildcat Foundation provides annual financial support for programs and projects not typically found in the District's budget, the Wildcat Foundation has also been instrumental in notable District-wide capital improvements.



Led by the Wildcat Foundation, and supported by businesses and individual donors across the region in 2007, funds were raised to install a synthetic turf field and improve parking and bleacher seating at John H. Frederick Field, the first time this stadium had been touched significantly since it was built in 1947.

The Foundation again solicited the community and received support to build the Trails and Trees Environmental Center, a near one-of-a-kind educational center.

The Trails and Trees Environmental Center is located on South York Street in Mechanicsburg. From the center you can see "The Greater Valley," one of the most beautiful sights in Mechanicsburg. At the center there is a forest, a large meadow, trails, springs, a stream, a modern pavilion, and a pre-Civil War farm house.⁵

With classroom labs, outdoor pavilions, blue bird trail, native trees and gardens, and a natural watershed, the Environmental Center serves as nature's classroom and has grown into a great educational asset for both our students and our shared community.

\$2,500,000 FUNDRAISING GOAL!

Paying homage to our past, TOGETHER, we will build for the future.

- Existing archway commemorating the John H. Frederick Memorial Field will be moved to provide a canopy, arching a new entrance and ticketing booths.
- Existing block structures will be repurposed for functional, modern use as support facilities.
 - Retrofit Current Team Rooms:
 - ♦ Public restrooms for men and women, each containing 20 private stalls
 - ♦ Officials' locker room with showers
 - ♦ Storage space
 - Retrofit current concessions
- Construction of new field house to include:
 - Two team rooms to accommodate teams of 40, with lockers, shower, restrooms, bench seating and training rooms
- Hall of Fame, between locker rooms, will serve as a natural walkway and include and expand upon memorial plaques, recognizing MASH alumni who gave the ultimate sacrifice in our nation's armed conflicts.
